B 1-2 Applied Project Management (2 CP)

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Course description

Successfully managing a PhD-project is a demanding task that involves more skills than “just” writing or carrying out experiments. It is a project in the sense that it often involves several stakeholders (e.g. fellow PhD-students, professors, technicians), it has a beginning and an end, and the outcome is a unique product. It therefore demands the application of basic project management methods. These methods are not only key to successfully managing research projects but also vital to any other complex project. In this online-course participants will get familiar with basic methods of project management. They will solidify the learned methods by applying them to their own PhD-projects. Hence, this course will help participants to get a grip on their PhD-project.

Target Audience, Number of Participants

Doctoral Candidates of JGU Mainz with a good command of English. The course is recommended for doctorates in an **early phase of their doctorate**.

Maximum number of participants: 12 persons

Prerequisites
